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Dear Value Customer,

On October 7, 2010, the U.S. EPA amended the date by which facilities with oil, gasoline and or diesel storage tanks must prepare or amend Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure **(SPCC)** Plans, and implement those Plans. The new compliance date is November 10,2011.

What is a SPCC Plan ?

A) Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure Plan

B) Purpose – To develop plans designed to prevent oil discharges from reaching navigable waters such as streams, creeks, rivers, lakes and wetlands adjacent to a navigable waterway

You must have an SPCC Plan if:

A) Facility stores 1,320 gallons of oil in aggregate above-ground ; and

B) Facility has a "reasonable expectation of an oil discharge" to waterway or adjoining shoreline.

For facilities with more than 10,000 gallons of storage, plans are required to be certified by a Professional Engineer (PE).

For facilities with 1,320 gallons and up to 10,000 gallons of storage, can opt to self-certify if the facility meets the three following requirements:

A) a total aboveground oil storage capacity of 10,000 U.S. gallons or less;

B) no aboveground oil storage containers with a capacity greater than 5,000 U.S. gallons; and C) in the 3 years prior to the date the SPCC Plan is certified, had no single discharge of oil to navigable waters or adjoining shorelines exceeding 1,000 U.S. gallons, or no two discharges of oil to navigable waters or adjoining shorelines each exceeding 42 U.S. gallons within any 12-month period.
